
Come on Coldstream people – where are you??



#### **Coldstream Premier Cru Cycling Club**

Summer is just around the next corner so come out of hibernation, get into the garage and dust down that poor neglected bike and get out there! Cycling is healthy. Cycling is cheap. Cycling is enjoyable.

Our rides have continued every week this year. We have not had to cancel any rides due to bad weather. Admittedly, we have got wet a few times but we have waterproof skins and the ability to recover quickly. There is no such thing as bad weather....just being badly prepared for whatever is thrown at us.



Some of the newest bikes to come onto the market have all mod cons ....but at a price! Compared with driving a car (electric, hybrid or fossil fuel powered) a bike can match all the latest developments for next to nothing. Air con...got it! Plug in power...we go to bed early! Music and entertainment...we sing and talk to each other! Comfort...we use correct clothing (and saddles!)! Telephone connectivity...we carry phones but only need them in case of emergency! Emergency braking...we have two brakes both front and rear! Lane assist...we have handlebars! Air suspension...we pump up our tyres!

The advantages over driving don't stop there. We pay no road tax. We have no MOTs each year. Our insurance costs are minimal. Depreciation is non existent. Maintenance and servicing is next to nothing.

We meet at 9am every Sunday at the Court House Car Park. We then cycle to Kelso to pick up more riders at 9.30am and then we all ride together for a 40/50 mile round trip. We always stop for coffee and cake at a half way point. We don't race. Our rides are purely social. Company, coffee and craic are the orders of the day! No-one gets left behind. If you don't feel up to doing a whole ride then you can join us but drop out at whatever point you feel comfortable with.

The Club is free to join. There are no membership fees to pay. A reliable bike and a reasonable level of fitness is all that is required. Age is no barrier (and no excuse!) Under 16s must be accompanied by a responsible adult and a cycling helmet MUST be worn. No helmet ...NO RIDE!


#### **COLDSTREAM PARISH CHURCH GUILD**

This was very interesting and a very worthwhile charity. This was followed by Lou Washington's talk on "The Life of the Honey Bee" which was fascinating and included a demonstration on how to make beeswax wraps. Our A.G.M. was on 25th March when a presentation of a National Gardening Voucher, together with a card signed by all the members, was made to Rev. #### **COLDSTREAM HEART RHYTHM**

Since we started last year we have been busy raising funds for more defibrillators in the town, and also training in basic life support and how to use the defibrillators.



We have been fortunate to receive further funding since our last newsletter entry - £2,250 from the Berwickshire Neighbourhood Support Fund, and £1,500 from the Berwickshire Housing Association.

We have purchased two new defibrillators as well as some training equipment. A new defibrillator has been installed at the bowling club, and the other is earmarked for a new site.

Training sessions have started, and we are now able to offer training in basic life support and the use of defibrillators, both to groups and individuals. Wouldn't it be great if the whole town was trained? Think of the lives that might be saved.


# Coldstream Art Group


